

Greens Committee Minutes September 17th 2009

Meeting called to order by Chair Gayland Archibald 2:02PM

Attending were members, Barry Kendall, Don McCormick, Ken McNeal, Jim Chumley, Robie Robinson, Scott Johnson and Bill Wallace. Randy King, General Manager and Kurt Richmond, Greens Superintendent also present.

Copies of minute of August 2009 meeting were provide and the motion to approve minutes as written made by Scott Johnson and Seconded by Ken McNeal. Minutes were approved.

Randy presented some numbers from the year to date Aug. 31st budget. Pro Shop Sales @ \$90,000 for year. Sales and Golf play is down by about 10 %. Many Courses are down up to 25%. Season Pass holders are down this year. Greens spending area positive and under budget year to Date. Expect larger spending in Sept. as we order the necessary supplies for preparation for winter.

Kurt reported on golf courses.

- #13 two major leaks repaired. Repair damage will be complete on Friday and sod laid over bad area.
- New tee on Men's C.C. #18 now finished and sod down. Requested that we drive by and take a look. Will start play on it next spring.
- Working on changing out sprinklers around greens to provide proper coverage. The fronts of several greens receiving too much water causing flooding off front and moss growing in several places. Like #2 Green.
- Will be ordering oil and products for winter shortly. Sand in storage now.
- Will fertilizer roughs on the course this winter and spring. For growth next year. Should much improve play and help keep theses area's green longer.
- Kurt plans on rebuilding the PRV valves on #14 this winter season.
- Is working on teach a new employee how to work on mowers/equipment.
- Filter Screen now working as designed.

Discussed the move of Employee from Facilities to Greens for the common area. Discussion of position followed. Motion to move this position made by Ken McNeal and Seconded by Don McCormick. Passed.

Gayland then discussed the new cart paths that are to be completed next week. Also discussed the plans for constructing one other path either #3 or #8 C.C. No objections to him choosing which path depending on costs and other factors that could change.

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Gayland talked about home owner/member complaints about lack of restroom on number six green. Homeowner suggested he would be taking pictures of person using his trees for a rest area. He also complained about the cart path dust.

The gate up the Green Canyon will be locked this coming Monday. Hunters and ATV are destroying the road up to the Drinking water springs. A sign will be posted warning that the gate will be closed and locked ahead. Hunters will still be allowed in the area but will need to walk in.

Kurt reported that he is down to eight employees and would like to have volunteers who would be willing to help mow on the course. They would need to register at the main office and be trained before starting work. Contact him if you're willing to work any amount of time on a mower.

Other items discussed

- Sprinklers that are being plugged with sand/dirt improving.
- Mowing new tee box on #5 tee for gold tee.
- Need more Tee markers made.
- Move ladies tee markers more often.
- Treatment for the White pine beetles will be done before snowfall.
- Ask that no players play on the course if frost is present. One of the nine holes will be left open for play until snow closed everything. Flagstick will be left in the hole to help players to find hole. This has not been done other years.
- The sprinkler water system will be blown out and closed for the season on about Oct. 15th. 2009
- Mowing of Aspen hills earlier next year so Rough between #2 and #3 can be mowed.
- Condition of the golf courses much improved this year.
- Cart paths a major improvement. Concrete will be poured Monday on #2 and the path on #7 C.C. is be completed today at a cost of just under \$1 a Sq. foot. This is for two layers of sealer.

The golf shop will close on Oct. 31st
